Political Prisoners in Burma!

According to Amnesty International and Assistance Association Political Prisoners (Burma):

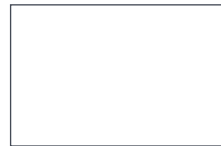
- More than 2,000 political prisoners including 225 monks, 269 students and 46 labor activists remain in various prisons.
- Prison conditions are deplorable. 146 prisoners have died since 1988 due to disease, malnutrition and maltreatment by prison authorities
- Imprisonment of political activists with lengthy sentences is common. Thirty seven former student leaders are currently serving 65 years in prison for their role in the 2007 Saffron Revolution.
- The release of all political prisoners, along with their free participation in the political process is an essential step towards acceptable political liberalization in Burma.

As a concerned Canadian, I strongly urge you to free all political prisoners in Burma.
